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## 2019 COASTLANDS VINEYARD PINOT NOIR SONOMA COAST

When winemaker and owner Ross Cobb's parents first came to the Sonoma Coast in the late eighties his mother Diane planted 16 rows of Pinot Noir across .75 acres. At the time UC Davis wasn't offering Dijon clones and so she put in one row each of heritage clones on their own root stocks. The rest of Coastlands Vineyard was planted with cuttings from the original block Diane planted.

Coastlands sits at 1150 feet above sea level and is just three miles from the Pacific Ocean. This vineyard features deep uplifted marine soils with lots of organic matter, a rarity for such high elevation. The winds from the Pacific Ocean greatly influence the vineyard, and the fog and winds roll in daily. This bottling is a combination of fruit from the Old Firs Block and the 1906 Block.

*Made with 60% whole clusters, the 2019 Pinot Noir Coastlands Vineyard has a medium ruby color and pure, continually shifting aromas of raspberry preserves, blood orange, sage, Earl Grey tea leaves and forest floor. The palate offers an abundance of silty tannins and surprising intensity of sweet berry fruit for its weight. It offers fine floral accents and finishes with fantastic length and nuance of flavor.*
